A new edition of "History of the Pidcock Family and Association" is in the works

Updating the family genealogy is the focus of the Pidcock Family Association's May 22 reunion at the Moore pavilion in the Bowman's Hill Wildflower Preserve, south of New Hope. The 1:30 business meeting will follow a noon potluck picnic. Family members are invited to bring genealogical information, family stories and ideas. The pavilion is near Pidcock Creek, on land John Pidcock settled in 1679. Members of the Pidcock Family Association trace their descent from his grandson, Jonathan Pidcock, who moved to Lambertville and then Amwell, NJ.

"Founded in 1913, the association is quickly approaching its centennial anniversary. We plan to complete and publish the 3rd edition of "History of the Pidcock Family and Association" in time for our 100th anniversary," said Cathy Pidcock Thomas, Association President.

"The first edition was printed in 1958, and the second came out in 1992. Pidcocks from different parts of the country have been submitting information about their branches of

the family tree that now spans 13 generations, and descends through six of Jonathan's seven children," said John L. Moore, who chairs the genealogy update project.

"We have even set up a special email address at pidcock2013@yahoo.com for Pidcock cousins to send in their data," Moore said. He welcomes Pidcock descendants contacting the association using the email address.
